Kent County childcare monetary amount data is based off one child/home. WIC enrollments are based on all children, not those eligible. Why are there higher rates of CPS investigation vs, 10 years ago? More mandated reporter training and a centralized access point to report. Vast number of cases are for neglect which indicate poverty and the

need to help support families with resources.

The pandemic has shown the greater community what those in early childhood already knew, our community and state is experiencing a childcare crisis. 7% or less of income is considered affordable but for most people it not in an affordable range. Only 9% of Michigan families can afford care. If the ability to afford care isn't an issue, access is. Childcare centers and providers typically are in high socio-economic areas for supply and demand purposes. Not working for childcare providers either. Some of our lowest wage worker and half are eligible for public assistance because pay is so low. Providers who do agree to accept subsidy will not find it is enough to cover the cost of care. Michigan has one of the lowest eligibility rates in the country for childcare subsidy. Goal is to get to 250% of the rate of FPL.

## Child Care Action Alert

### • Great Start Parent Coalition Report

- Books Blocks & Balls Event is August 14<sup>th</sup> from 10am 1pm and is transitioning to an in-person event with location TBD. This is a Help Me Grow Event with an emphasis on promoting developmental screenings. We would like partner giveaways to be early childhood development themed with a focus on building fine & gross motor skills. We will be sending out additional details soon, along with a suggested list of giveaways to our partner organizations for families. Email Tomarra and Nicole if you would like to participate.
- COFI: The second phase is beginning in July. Iris and Shanequa started out as graduates and are now facilitating. Families are still welcome to sign up and do not have to go through Phase One to do Phase Two.
- Trusted Advisors: The TA grant consists of Latinx and Northern Kent Coalition meetings which have both kicked off. Three Family Activity Nights will be held with accompanying kits for families to pick up. First is being held tonight and is Spring into Art. The next two are Summer STEM and Fall into Music. Parent Cafes are also being held in person in the SE Grand Rapids.
- Diaper Drive: Sparta United Methodist, a small local church collected over 11,000 diapers from Mother's Day to Father's Day.
- Iris shared she had three ICCF staff come to her Parent Support Station and they had questions about childcare. The information shared by MLPP will be great to share with them. They also want to partner with GSC as they serve families.

### • First Steps Kent Update

First Steps Kent will offer four funding opportunities this summer for the Ready by Five Early Childhood Millage. Funding opportunities will include Outreach and Navigation, Healthy Development, Early Learning, and Parent Support and Education. New for 2022 is Child Safety Initiatives under Parent Support and Education which will support providing pack and plays and car seats along with the accompanying education. Also Early Learning and Literacy. There will be two Pre-Proposal Conferences to provide information about the proposal process. Both sessions will contain the same information. ### • Great Start Readiness Program Update

There are 5873 slots, that total 2900 full day slots. There are currently 1833 students in the intake system. Governor Whitmer has proposed a GSRP expansion increasing slots to 17,400. Also increasing the per slot match to a full day to \$8,692. There is another \$50 million one time funding proposed to support expansion.

### • GSC Updates
