- Books, Blocks & Balls
 - Madonna Princer opened Alger Head Start because of rain, GSC able to hold the event indoors – Thank you!
 - > Attendance slightly lower: 100 adults, 96 children
 - > 55% of surveyed parents had never heard of ASQ
 - > 79% very likely/likely to complete an ASQ
 - Feedback was very positive
 - i. Event rating 94% completed survey rated Excellent or Very Good
 - > Doing a 2nd BBB 9-17 10-1 Sparta Baptist Church

 - AppleTree & Gilden Woods July drive is officially ended: 15,000+ diapers delivered to 8 pantries in the month of August.
 - > 44,440 diapers away from our 2 million diaper goal

Stabilization Grants

- Providers working on spending funds/completing reports
- Spring grant reports were released Aug 2, due March 1, 2023
- All unspent funds must be returned by March 15, 2023
- Summer grant app opened Aug 9, closes Sept 9
- As of today, 2,469 apps submitted statewide
- o 220 providers in Kent County have submitted summer grant apps
- 440 providers in Kent County have not applied (340 are eligible)
- MDE's tax webinars held this week
- o Thanks to everyone who helped direct providers to their office
- o GSQ undergoing a facelift
 - i. Programs renewing or receiving new Star rating with an on-site assessments (4-5 star) the deadline has passed
 - ii. ...without an on-site assessment (1-3 Star) the timeline is

• FY22 guidance and funding allocations rolled out this week

- o GSC will share out new FY 2022/23 Work Plan Guidance
 - Incorporating goals/strategies from the Strengthening Families Assessment throughout the plan
 - Engaging more diverse communities
 - Engaging more fathers and male role models
 - Goals need to address early childhood and systems
- Paula and Jaime Mueller meet regularly to discuss early childhood
- Allocations are kept level
 - 32p Allocation = \$411,231
 - No major changes. GSC/PC base: \$120,000.
 - EC programming: \$15,000. 20% of the budget actually goes to programming.
 - 32p4 Allocation = \$249,872 (level funding)
- 32p Local Program Funds Guidance
- Strategic Planning
 - Process to Date
 - Leveraging reports community has already generated i.e. Statewide HMGK strategic plan
 - Working to gather data from parent surveys, listening sessions, community events
 - Looked at goals from Office of Great Start in last GSC meeting
 - Small Group Work

- The plan today is small group discussion regarding whether we are meeting our goals, what we can do to address them, where do we have the most impact. 4 groups each with a GSC moderator.
- Moderator feedback
 - Group 1/Outcome 1
 - Making the presence of the GSC more known in the medical area
 - Engaging with partners
 - Medical pre-natal and post-partum insurance coverage
 - Engaging fathers
 - Group 2/Outcome 2
 - Streamlining resources, having a centralized information hub, families don't know how to access info.
 - Families don't trust people in systems work
 - Standards of cultural competency: language and themes
 - Info/resources for children 5-3rd grade (HGM ends at 5)
 - Group 3/Outcome 3
 - What impacts will Covid have in future? Will developmental delays increase?
 - Staffing crisis is difficult to address. Not enough support for teachers in the classroom.
 - Kindergarten teachers need more support
 - Group 4/Outcome 4
 - Working more with medical communities/pediatricians' offices, new parent kits, storybook walks
