- MI Recovery https://mirecovery.org/
 - i. The program has been in place approximately 6 years, new emphasis on pregnancy (6 months)
- Universal substance screening during OB visits so children are born healthy

- It is more difficult for healthcare workers to ask a pregnant woman about substance use during pregnancy if they don't know how to help when she says yes.
- Website of resources for women identified as substance users: how to access resources, outcomes for children born to a mother who used substances during pregnancy, steps toward recovery.
- Stigma reduction = healthier babies

- S/E Health Workgroup focuses on the impact of S/E development on school readiness
- Viewed 7 videos developed by the workgroup
 - i. Brief Interactions, By Reading, Early Learning, Growing Stronger, Join in the Play!, Learn Best Through Play, Unstructured Play
 - ii. Feedback from the group: love the bite-sized nugget length of each video; GRCM Megan Geiken will connect with Melanie about sharing on their site; would like to see them shared in newsletters, websites, GSC website; lots of reel followers on partner Instagram pages; TikTok?, subtitles can be produced in 7 languages (Sara Proano)
- Small Group Activity
 - O What does it mean to bring an "equity lens" to your work?
 - i. Group 1 (Iris, Fredericka, Yolanda, Sharquila, Angela)
 - 1. Yolanda: Non-judgment; understanding your own unconscious bias; trust building; awareness of trauma; listen; historically punitive environments; equity is used as a buzzword; learn from mistakes
 - ii. Group 2 (Jenn, Merin, Alyssa, Rebecca, Kathie)
 - Collaborative discussions to expand ideas and views; focus is often through lens of white
 privilege; be conscious of the words: cultural competence and humility; diversifying our
 workplace (lots of white women); explore ways to push DEI; awareness of the wheel of
 privilege, race, mental health, housing etc.; amplify parent voice-consider lived
 experience; encourage vulnerability and feedback
 - iii. Group 3 (K'Sandra, Abby, Joann, Tomarra, Shanequa)
 - 1. Look for gaps in subgroups; policies have unintended consequences-look at the longterm impacts before putting policy in place; equity in ECE; the challenge of dismantling systems
 - iv. Group 4 (Kevin, Sara, Ryan, Wendy, Kristin, Sarah)
 - 1. Addressing accessibility issues; presence; systemic and policy issues-looking upstream is where sustained change comes; include families in the planning and design of services
 - 2. "Good communities support their own children; great communities support all children."

Partner Updates

2022 Successes & Highlights

- Sara (KDL): Books for Babies initiative-choose a book and those in direct contact with newborns can get books. Calendars with Success Basics are available here or upon request. Every branch has revamped their play space, every library has a theme using Loose Parts (unstructured play): called Wonder Nook. Wimee's Words relaunch in 2023; current exhibit at GRCM.

- Kevin (KDL): Breaking away from FB and YouTube (unsafe) and using an online virtual broadcasting platform. The focus is interactive programming, not just kids watching tv. Working with Casual Simulation who may allow live interactive viewing. The Bookmobile can visit agencies with this programming. Will be available in multiple locations (such as daycare centers) to make it more accessible.
 - There is an option at KDL to rent tablets and hotspots. Community members who are not residents of an individual branch region can use an institutional card.

- o GRCM is bringing back "New Year's Early Eve" December 30 4pm-6pm. They are a participant in the Museums For All programming (\$1.75) and pay-what-you-can membership (\$20/year)

- CTC has lots of new programming: Staycation ages 2–14 can be dropped off for 3 hours while kids receive therapy services (registration closes tomorrow); will be offered again during spring break.
 Preteen and Teen program partners with GVSU: video game playing and educational session for parents about the benefits of gaming. Playgroups are starting again in February.

- CLC: Focusing on 0-3 prekindergarten: feeding and dressing for children with cerebral palsy. Currently
 offering an 80% reduced rate for 1st 4 weeks. Free assessments every 2 months. Physician referrals not
 required, working hard to get insurance coverage.
