Michigan Lifelong Education, Advancement, and Potential

- o Early Childhood Education, Higher Education, Education Partnerships- 3 offices
 - Early Childhood Education lead statewide efforts to ensure that all young children meet their developmental milestones and enter kindergarten with the tools and ability to succeed in school.
 - Higher Education lead statewide efforts to ensure that every Michigander has the skill certificate or degree they need to prosper
 - Education Partnerships lead statewide efforts to build and sustain partnerships that enhance educational opportunities and outcomes throughout the state from preschool through postsecondary education ensures all available resources, data, and dollars are aligned around a single vision—building an education system from preschool through postsecondary that can support children and families
- ➤ MiFamily Engagement Centers & Literacy Hub Grant
 - 35i-ISD to apply for our area is Ottawa County ISD
 - United Way Lakeshore will remain as the Literacy Hub
 - 35i \$14,000,000 over the next 4 years to intermediate districts or consortia of intermediate districts to administer 10 MiFamily Engagement Centers across this state.
 - Within each MiFamily Center, \$120,000 must be dedicated to continuing the work of the Literacy Support Network Hub in each area
 - Funds must be used by MiFamily Engagement Centers for compensation and travel for coordinators and coaches, launching activities, including, but not limited to, training, coaching, technical assistance, resource development, and online learning modules.
 - In addition to the MiFamily Center funds, there is allocated for 2023-2024 only \$2,000,000.00 to implement a statewide campaign to share how parents can support early literacy for children from birth to grade 5

- o Are these strategies in alignment with the goals?
 - Add a two generational/multigenerational approach to the strategies by addressing the literacy of the parents as well. Emerging adult learners book at a level they could read. Promoting family literacy. Karrie Roy, Director Family Literacy Program, may be a good resource for this strategy.
 - [LeeAnne question] Is there a way to help children with literacy that do no have a desire to read a book. Are there other strategies that can help children? GSFC response: The January GSFC meeting on storytelling led by Jacque Viol will help with this along with the March GSFC meeting.
 - [Jennifer suggestion] Is there data that can be sprinkled in with the strategies that are listed to help determine/track if the strategies are making progress towards the goals.
- Are there additional revisions/work needed?
 - What is happening county wide to support family literacy? One response: Literacy classes
 are happening in schools to support parental literacy.
